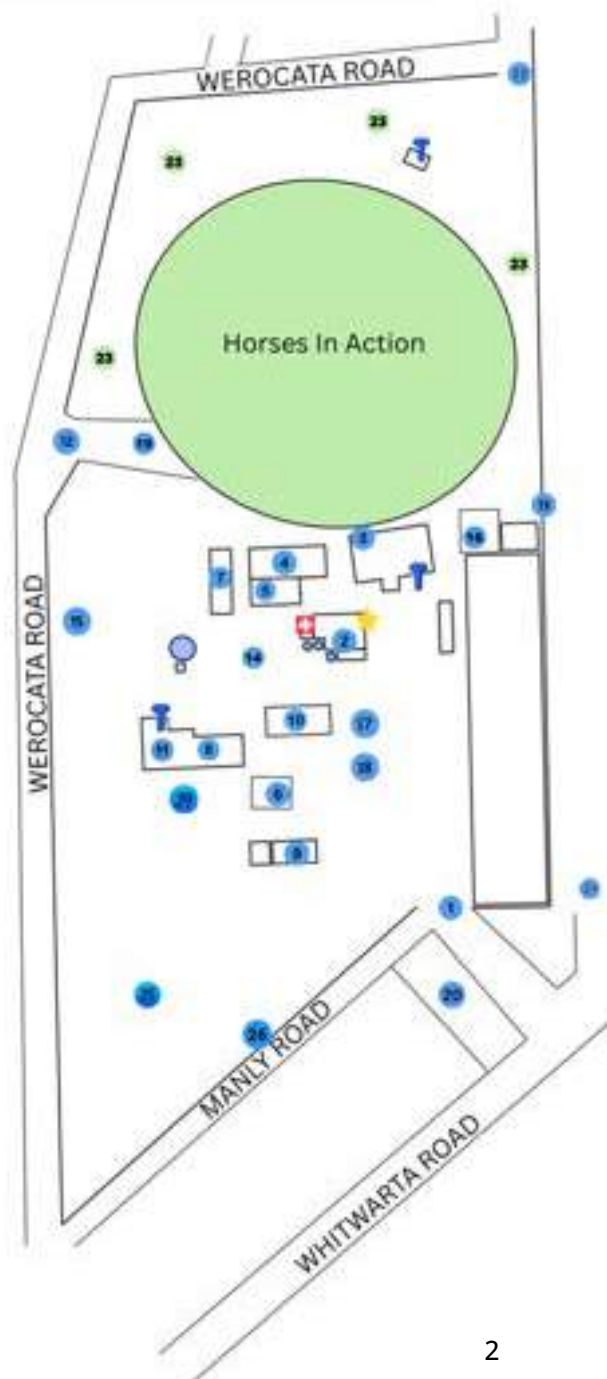

REGULATIONS

- Membership is \$30 and includes 4 tickets (2 Adults and 2 Children 17 years and under). \$15 Single Membership includes 1 Adult ticket. \$5 Junior Membership includes 1 Child 17 and under ticket. \$20 Couples Concession Membership includes 2 Adult Tickets. \$10 Single Concession Membership includes 1 Adult Ticket. These are due annually by Show Day. All of the above can be obtained from the Secretary's Office during show week.
- Exhibitors must place their exhibits in the space allocated to them by the Convenor, and shall remain under the sole control of the Convenor until judging is completed, or will be disqualified.
- No person or persons will be admitted to the Pavilions. Yards, Tents, Show Rings, Enclosure or Roped Off Space while the article or stock are being judged except one person in charge of horses, committee and judges, the two latter of whom will wear distinctive badges.
- The Judges are recommended to withhold prizes where they think necessary, or may award a second or third in lieu of a first and second.
- Protest accompanied by a fee of 50 per cent of the amount of the first prize must be lodged in writing with the Secretary one hour after judging on the day of the Exhibition. Deposit forfeited to the Society if the protest is not upheld. All protests and disputes will be decided by the Executive Committee.
- Entries received by post will not be accepted unless accompanied by the amount of entrance money. Entry Forms to be filled in. Telephone entries must be confirmed in writing.
- Any exhibitor or attendant refusing to attach the prize card or ribbon to any exhibit to which a prize is awarded, and to keep the same on during the hours of exhibition, may on proof thereof to the Committee forfeit all prizes awarded to such exhibit during the Show and may be disqualified from again competing.
- Should there be any reason to suspect that any exhibit is either diseased or dangerous, the Society reserves the right of refusing admittance to or removing same from the ground at the expense of the exhibitor.
- No entry will be received from any person disqualified by this Society or by the Northern Agricultural Shows Association during the period of such disqualification, and should entry be accidentally accepted it shall when discovered be deemed void and the entry fee may be forfeited.
- Winners of cups and trophies which must be won more than once in order to become the absolute property of the final winner will be held in trust by the Society until such cup or trophy is won outright.
- The contents of the Prize List have been carefully compiled, and are believed to be correct at the time of printing.
- No amplifier other than those used by and under the control of the Society will be allowed on the grounds.
- No refunds of entry fees will be issued.
- Strictly no late entries. Please carefully read the section schedule as to when entries close. Sheep and Cattle are an exception.

Claire Catford lives locally in Hoyleton, and, with her husband Dillon, is involved in their family farming business who recently celebrated 100 years on the land.

Growing up on a farm and having a background in agricultural science, Claire has practical experience and formal training, but it's her passion for the people in agriculture that is really important to her.

Claire is a 2025 Nuffield Scholar, supported by the Grains Research and Development Corporation (GRDC), studying what she describes as a “dynamic duo” - thriving farmers and vibrant communities. She has travelled to ten countries over the last year, in an attempt to understand how changing pressures in agriculture such as increasing scale, social and environmental expectations, and changing rural populations, are impacting farmer wellbeing, and what can be done to better support those at the centre of the industry and the communities around them.

Important to Claire, is her involvement with the farmer health initiative “Fat Farmers,” where she helps bring people together, weekly, through fitness, connection, and open conversations about mental health in rural communities. She’s a strong believer that simple, grassroots efforts can make a real difference.

Claire is passionate about strengthening rural communities so farmers not only stay in the industry, but so there is a place for future generations to thrive in it too. Her studies are based on real experiences and with a clear goal to understand how to build stronger, more connected communities that support resilient, healthy farmers now and into the future.

CRITERIA FOR JUDGING CUT FLOWERS



There is no such thing as the perfect flower. Every bloom has some imperfection, however minute. You just hope no-one else has a better one.

Generally speaking, a bloom should be circular in outline, with as long a stem as possible and showing some foliage on the stem.

- Stems should be face on to the judges but those which naturally face the ceiling, eg carnations, should have stems plugged in their bottles so they are erect and not leaning to one side.
- Plugs can be rhubarb or arum lily stems for soft stemmed flowers, eg gerberas. Foam or polystyrene can also be used. They can be used also the wedge the stem forward. Hard stemmed exhibits such as roses or natives can have cork cut in half for plugs. It is acceptable for plugs to stick up above the neck of a bottle.
- In a composite exhibit flowers should be of a similar size, or if of varied size, the largest and tallest flowers should be at the back grading to smallest and shortest at the front.
- Aids such as wires through stems, (except sweet peas), cotton wool to separate petals, sticky tape or pins to repair or compact blooms are unacceptable.

Anemones:

Large flowers with clear colours fully open with petals curving backwards. The stems are to be long, firm and straight and in balance with the size of the flower.

Calendulas:

Large flowers with closed centre preferably, circular in outline and clear colour with no fading of the edges of the petals

Daffodils:

Top petal should be at 12 o'clock and the bottom at 6.

Tulips:

Tulips should be round.

Geraniums:

A well - shaped bloom should be ball shaped with florets curving backwards or reflexing right back to the stem. Florets should touch each other but can overlap a little. Stems should be stiff and strong.

Iris: Bearded:

Should have at least 2 florets open and the three upright or standard petals should meet at the top and the three pendulous petals , or falls, should be evenly spaced and well balanced. Can have 3 or more flowers showing.

Dutch:

These should have the three top petals or ears meeting at the top and the three falls should be evenly spaced and level at the bottom. Penalties exit for showing second flower colour.

Pansies:

This flower should have a circular outline of 5 uniform petals. The two top petals shall have their base directly above the centre of the eye with the other three placed to form a balanced circle. Blotches should be clear, solid colour and comprise half the petal area. Colours should be clear and bright.

Violas:

Violas have just one colour as distinct from pansies and will be devoid of the weeping eye as should the pansy.

Poppies – Iceland:

These should have large open-cup shaped blooms circular or saucer-shaped in outline and petals symmetrical with firm undamaged margins. Colours should be bright and fresh with no fading at the edges. Stems should be strong, straight and long. The anthers should be well endowed with pollen but none seen on the petals.

Daisies:

Should be flat.

Lillies:

Lily stamen should be in a vertical line with the stem and clear. Bloom should be un-creased.

Ranunculas:

These should be semi-globular with support petals acting thus to the upper petals. The body should be a closely packed mass of incurved petals right to the centre which should be centre and completely obscured. The bloom should sit directly on top of the stem with no insect damage. Should be perfectly circled.

Sweet peas:

Petals of the florets should have an unbroken smooth outline, even in size, fresh, pure of colour, free from blemish, burn or any other colour. Florets must be evenly spaced on the stems, and all should face the front. Stem should be strong and straight.

Carnations:

These should be large and evenly rounded with guard petals fitting up tight under the bloom. The inner petals should lie regularly and smoothly over the guard petals and get smaller as they approach the centre of the bloom. The central petals should rise above the centre of the bloom. A good carnation should be flat at the base and nicely convexed at the top. Stems should be straight and long and in keeping with the size of the flower.

Statis:

Blooms should be evenly balanced.

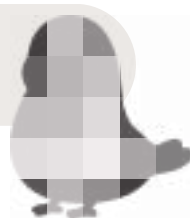

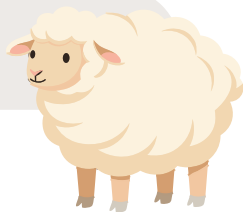

New laws to create more smoke-free
and vape-free areas from 1 March 2024

From 1 March 2024, new laws will ban smoking and vaping in a variety of public outdoor areas in South Australia. Regulations under the South Australian Tobacco and E-Cigarette Products Act 1997 are being introduced to address risks associated with passive tobacco smoking and passive inhalation of e-cigarette aerosol. This will occur through the creation of smoke-free and vape-free areas in the following areas: at and within ten (10) metres of non-residential building entrances, such as entrances to shopping centres, government and commercial buildings.

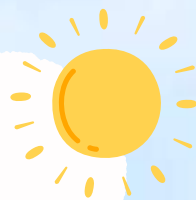

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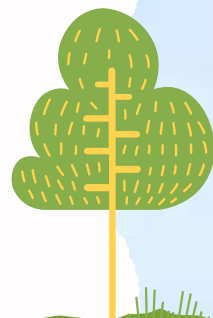
